2019 GALA

In June, Kaufman Music Center hosted its annual Gala benefiting music education at Guastavino's. More than 370 guests attended and enjoyed an exclusive performance by pioneering composer, vocalist, violinist, and producer Caroline Shaw – the youngest ever recipient of the Pulitzer Prize for Music. Ms. Shaw appeared alongside the Attacca Quartet and the Special Music School High School Men's Choir, premiering a new arrangement of her composition "Find the Line".

This year we were proud to honor Cathy White O'Rourke, President of our Board of Trustees, for her 20+ years of service to the Center. In addition, The Morris and Alma Schapiro Fund was honored for its significant support of Special Music School, which has enabled the School to thrive and transform countless young lives.

The Gala celebrated our community of **2,075** individuals, foundations, corporations, and government agencies who gave **\$3.26 million** to support Kaufman Music Center in 2018-19.

JEROME L. GREENE FOUNDATION


In April, we announced that the Jerome L. Greene Foundation became one of Special Music School High School's newest benefactors, having pledged an extraordinary gift of \$300,000 in support of the High School's innovative music program.

The Foundation joins an illustrious list of institutions supporting Special Music School, including the Edwin Caplin Foundation, The Morris and Alma Schapiro Fund, and the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs in partnership with the City Council.

"Music education in New York City's public schools is an area that is underfunded and all but forgotten," says Chris McInerney, President and CEO of the Jerome L. Greene Foundation. "We believe strongly in the transformative power of the arts. Music is a vital part of arts education and we couldn't be more proud to partner with Kaufman Music Center to support the SMS music program."

SPECIAL MUSIC SCHOOL (M859)

Special Music School is New York City's only K-12 public school that teaches music as a core subject, and the School represents a unique partnership between Kaufman Music Center and the NYC Department of Education. The Center's Fund for Music Education fully funds the music program, allowing students to study without the financial barriers associated with world-class musical education. Our graduates attend top colleges and conservatories, including The Juilliard School, New England Conservatory, Bard College and Conservatory, Berklee College of Music, Columbia University, Oberlin College, and Smith College.







FACE THE MUSIC

Face the Music is the country's premier youth program dedicated to music by living composers. Students come from 40+ schools across all five boroughs. In 2018-19, students had the opportunity to study with renowned artists including: Missy Mazzoli, Claire Chase, Helga Davis, Mazz Swift, Brooklyn Raga Massive, and the International Contemporary Ensemble. The program also hosted a string quartet residency program with ETHEL and performed with rock legend Todd Rundgren as part of *Ecstatic Music* in Merkin Hall. Students had opportunities to appear at other prestigious venues including The Rubin Museum, National Sawdust, and Roulette.

LUCY MOSES SCHOOL THEATER@KAUFMAN

New York City's largest community music school, Lucy Music School offers private instrument lessons as well as classes in music, dance, and theater to students of all ages – from toddlers to seniors – and levels of experience. In 2018-19, the School welcomed over 3,000 learners of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds who found classes and teachers that engaged, empowered, and inspired them.

MERKIN HALL

Merkin Hall's 2018-19 season was exceptional. *Tuesday Matinees*, the Hall's longest running series, showcased rising stars like violinist Tessa Lark and the Argus Quartet. In February, the Hall debuted a new concert series, *Only at Merkin with Terrance McKnight*, providing audience members with insightful conversations and virtuosic performances by acclaimed pianists Ursula Oppens and André Watts and harpist Bridget Kibbey. The Center also presented groundbreaking new works at the ninth season of *Ecstatic Music*: a six-concert series featuring adventurous artist collaborations representing a diverse collection genres and sounds.

In July 2019, we launched the Innovators Circle, a membership group for leadership supporters of the Hall. Members of the Circle will access exclusive benefits during the 2019-20 season, including an invitation to a private concert and cocktail reception with Rob Kapilow, attendance at dress rehearsals for some of our celebrated concert series, and special recognition in Merkin Hall programs.
